- 6. Between 600 and 800 engineers, probably belonging to the 36th Pontoon Bridge Regiment of the GOFG in Magdeburg, arrived at the engineer training site east of Rosslau between 8 and 10 April.
- 7. On 15 April, motor vehicles of the 7th Guards Tank Division and nine tanks from the Gross Kuehnau camp were loaded on five trains at the Dessau railroad station.
- 8. Forty-two T-34 tanks and other equipment were dispatched from Cottbus toward Weisswasser between 15 and 17 April. Other units stationed in the Dissenchen and Alvensleben casernes marched by road toward Muskau. A train carrying 15 JSU-152's passed through Cottbus, enroute to Weisswasser, on 16 April.
- 9. Units of the 7th Guards Mechanized Division from the barracks on Braunsdorferstrasse in Fuerstenwalde were entrained on five trains between 15 and 17 April.
- 10. Troops were unloaded at the Dranse and Wittstock railroad stations between 12 and 18 April. Four of the trains unloaded at Dranse carried a total of 53 tanks and SP guns. An undetermined number of tanks, howitzers and mortars were unloaded from four of the trains arriving at Wittstock.

25X1A Comment.

- 1. The presence of 300 flatcars and boxcars at the Weimar railroad station had been observed on 9 April. It is believed that the entrained troops, probably elements of the 20th Guards Mechanized Division, moved to Camp Crawinkel near Ohrdruf.
- 2. The division moved to the Lossa training grounds.
