4.	The staff of the infantry unit is stationed in the barracks area. This unit replaced the 39 Infantry Regiment of the 9 Division which was transferred from Nevrokop before April 1951 (probably during 1950). 39 Infantry Regiment was moved to Simitli (N 41-53, E 23-06) in 1950 and at least a part of the regiment is presently located in the artillery barracks at Breznik.

5.	An unidentified infantry unit is located in Lyubimets (N 41-50, E 26-05). About April 1952, the unit was transferred from Khaskovo, and is subordinate to the Khaskovo garrison. After the move to Lyubimets, details from this unit were assigned to work on excavation of fortifications along the Bulgarian-Turkish and Bulgarian-Greek frontiers.				
6.	The unit included a heavy machine gun company armed with six Maksim Sokolov machine guns, each served by five men armed with the following weapons:
