1. [redacted] 26 MiG-15s, 18 Pe-2s and 1 biplane at Deutsch Wagram (P 49/S 50) airfield. There was a 3/10 overcast, a westerly wind of about 8 km/h and good visibility. No air activity was observed. The AA gun emplacements were not occupied or guarded by sentries.

black-bordered blue epaulets coming from the direction of Strasshof stopped in front of the building. The building near the school, which was guarded by sentries wearing black-bordered blue epaulets, was apparently used as quarters by a workshop unit. There was intensive traffic by officers and EM wearing black-bordered blue epaulets. The roads extending south and north of the former school building were blocked. West of the southern road block there was an antenna mast in a small park and next to the mast was a van-like truck with a rod antenna. Two other trucks [redacted] the drivers of both trucks

wearing black-bordered blue epaulets moved to this site.

- 3. At Strasshof military post, 29 motor vehicles including 3 tank trucks were observed in the garages in the camp along the edge of the wood. No stored weapons or equipment were seen.

[redacted] drivers wearing black-bordered blue epaulets were observed in vehicular traffic. About 25 soldiers wearing black-bordered blue epaulets were seen in front of the temporary buildings of the cantonment. Two trucks were parked in the yard of the smaller headquarters which was frequented by five uniformed women wearing black-bordered blue epaulets.

[redacted] The driver was apparently in Strasshof for the first time. Sentries wearing black-bordered blue epaulets were posted in front of the aircraft repair shop in which no activity was observed. Four gray boxes and a small pulley block were seen in front of one temporary building.

[redacted] Comment. Deutsch Wagram airfield is occupied by a fighter regiment. It is possible that the Fe-2s observed belong to a bomber regiment which was transferred from Aspern [redacted]
