1. Between 1 July and 30 September 1953, an average number of 60 trucks arrived each week at the food ration supply depot in Frankfurt/Oder to pick up supply.



2. [Redacted] in July 1953, the stocks at the main food ration supply depot dropped to 1,500 tons equivalent to one third of the prescribed quantity. The stocks would have to be refilled until the fall, with the mills in Lieberose scheduled to deliver 3,300 tons of flour in the fall.

3. At the beginning of September, about 150 field kitchens, 10 mobile field bakeries and large quantities of crockery and mess kits were stored in Winterhafen (winter harbor). 3

4. The following is a list of incoming and outgoing rail shipments dispatched by, or arriving at, the main food ration supply depot in Frankfurt/Oder between 1 July and 30 September 1953:

1.  Comment. With each motor vehicle carried as having a load capacity of about 3 tons, the weekly amount of food ration supply picked up directly by the troops is about 200 tons or about 10 percent of the total delivery. The motor vehicles belong to the 7th Gds Mecz Div, 32d AAA Div, to MVD and GOFG units, all of which stationed in Frankfurt/Oder.
2.  Comment. The volume of outgoing shipments surpassed that of incoming shipments  which accounts for the drop in the stock of supply.  This measure has probably been taken to meet the serious food  at Germany. 25X1
3.  Comment. The depot of field kitchens, field bakeries and kitchen utensils in Winterhafen  and is subordinate to the main food ration supply depot. 25X1
4.  Comment. The volume of incoming shipments decreased further as compared with that during the second quarter of 1953.
5.  Comment. The average volume of outgoing shipments is about that observed during the second quarter of 1953.
6.  Comment. According to a report hitherto unsubstantiated, the food ration supply depot of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army had been transferred to the sawmill in Pinowitz from Eberswalde in August.
7.  Comment. The insignificant difference in the amount of outgoing shipments in July as compared with the data given in paragraph 4 was previously commented upon.  The data for August supplement the data given in paragraph 4 which only contained the second half of the month. The officers mentioned are known as supply officers in these posts. 25X1
