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2. Comment. The air force fuel depot at Aken had the following supply traffic in the fourth quarter of 1953:

The volume of incoming shipments, like that of outgoing shipments, both indicated by tons, were on the same level. The increased deliveries in October resulted from the high fuel consumption during the Soviet Army maneuvers in the Thuringian area which involved many elements of the Twenty-Fourth Air Army.

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
