

- 1. The 1954 surveying plan of Csellydrographischer Dienst (Paritimo Hydrographical Service) (SHD) in Stralaund for surveying teams Nos 1 and 3 included the survey of the east coast of Ruegen Island and of the Baltic Sea coast from Pinz as far as the Polish frontier at Ahlbeck with a total of 15 charts of to the scale of 1:10000. Maritime surveying team 2 had to make 5 charts of the surroundings of Tarnewitz to the scale of 1:10000.
- 2. The Stralsund SHD shore surveying team was equipped with two TH 40-type theodolites one Th-II-type theodolite, one TH-030-type theodolite and one Ni 30-type leveling device. Each of the maritime surveying teams 1 through 4 were equipped with four sextants (micrometer sextants copied by the Optik-Freiberg firm from the Plath micrometer sextant), one large station pointer, one small station pointer, one deck watch and one lead and leadling.
- 3. Surveying vessel JOHANN L. KRUEGER, which worked for the Oceanographical Institute, was equipped with three or four current-meters, water-thermometers, a tilting thermometer, a lottom grab device and a laboratory for analyses. Each of the surveying vessels JORDAN, MACNETOLOGE, GAUSS and JOHANN 1. KRUEGER had an echosounder and a radio set, which was serviced by a sea police radio operator. Surveying vessel ALFRED MAZ was equipped with an echosounder and a gyrocompass with six repeater compasses.

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
