3. On 20 February 1954, the best EM and NCOs of the 2nd infantry regiment were awarded book prizes. Subsequently discussions were held designed to induce those whose three-year term of service terminated in late 1954 to re-enlist for another three years. Between early January and early March 1954, 70 new recruits arrived at the 2d infantry regiment; most of these recruits came from Thuringia. The regiment was assigned a quota of 300 men to be newly recruited.
4. On 2 and 3 March 1954, a field exercise was held by the 2d infantry regiment about 15 km west of Frenzlau in Zwerwelin Forst. About 1,200 men and all the vehicles and artillery pieces of the regiment took part. The infantry units marched to the training area via Schoenermark and Arendsee. The objective of the exercise was to train the regiment for defense and attack operations. Similar field exercises were held by the 1st and 3rd infantry regiments. Between 8 and 11 March 1954, a sand-table exercise was held for officers of the division headquarters, allegedly in preparation for an expected exercise at division level. Between 24 and 27 March, such sand-table exercises were scheduled to be held by all the three infantry regiments of the division. On 23 March, the 2d infantry regiment began advanced combat practice firing with all weapons in the Jaegerbrueck area. <sup>2</sup>
5. In mid-March 1954, the motorcycle company of the 2d infantry regiment received 37 new Soviet model M-72 sidecar motorcycles. <sup>3</sup>
6. During the reported period, the morale of the KVP soldiers was rather poor. In particular, the shortage of fuel and the reduction of the daily potato rations from 1,000 to 500 grams per capita had a detrimental effect on the mood of the soldiers.
