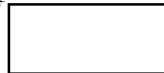

25X1 1. [redacted] Comment. Raw material deliveries to the Foundry Combine East (EKO) at Fuerstenberg/Oder. In February 1954, a total of 48,753 tons of iron ore arrived there from the USSR. [redacted]

25X1 2. [redacted] Comment. In February, a total of 624 carloads of uranium ore was dispatched to the USSR.

25X1 3. [redacted] Comment. Two trains, each carrying 40 trucks with pontoons had already been observed on 13 April 1954. [redacted]. The shipment mentioned in the present report was probably consigned to the central engineer equipment depot of the GOPG in Ketschendorf south of Fuerstenwalde. However, this assumption would rule out the possibility that the train was dispatched in the direction of Cottbus.

25X1 4. [redacted] Comment. This shipment was probably consigned to the tank spare parts depot of the GOPG in Muellrose.
