1. About 50 Soviet aircraft, including at least 12 jets, were observed at the Bagicz (Bogcice) airfield, 8 kilometers east-northeast of Kolobrzeg (Kolberg) and north of the Kolobrzeg-Koszalin (Koslin) road.
2. There are approximately 16 large-caliber Soviet antiaircraft cannons set up at Bagicz. In addition, there are four antiaircraft cannons, belonging to the Polish coast artillery, along the coast north of the airfield.
