<u>Comment</u>: Several reports received in the past year have mentioned the German vessel SEEBURG (also reported as ZEIBURG and ZEEBRUGGE). However it cannot be ascertained if it is identical with the JASTARNIA. the SEEBURG was sunk near Jastarnia while evacuating high-ranking German families from Poland. The ship was refloated in 1953 but had to be sunk again due to technical difficulties. This report added that it was expected that the ship would again be
