- 5. The soldiers received seven zlotys and about 100 grams of tobacco per month. The normal military service lasted 37 months. Soldiers who had attended NCO school or had some other special training had to serve several additional months. The majority of the soldiers complained of poor food. The morale was very low; soldiers waited for the day they would be released from service.
- The regiment had its own NCO school where all the NCOs with exception of signalmen were trained.
- 7. The men had to attend three hours of political education each day. The first month they were taught the military oath which they had to take at the end of the month. Then followed the lectures on the Soviet peace movement, the Five-Year Plan, life stories of the famous Communist leaders, etc. Those soldiers who showed an intelligent interest in the political education were allowed to leave the barracks as a reward.


