In August 1954, the Soviets erected a new border post at Kalaputi (N 38-48, E 48-25) in the Azerbaijdzhan SSR near the Iranian border. Four engineers and eleven civilian laborers took part in the construction of this new and modern building, which had two extra rooms. In the opinion of source, the purpose of the two additional rooms was to provide for political officers, who frequently contact persons at the Iranian border. On the wall of the new Kalaputi Post is written in Russian: "Long Live the Socialistic October Revolution of the USSR". The number "9", which is the number of the Kalaputi Post, can also be seen in front of the building.
