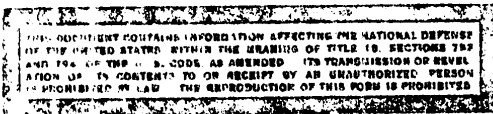

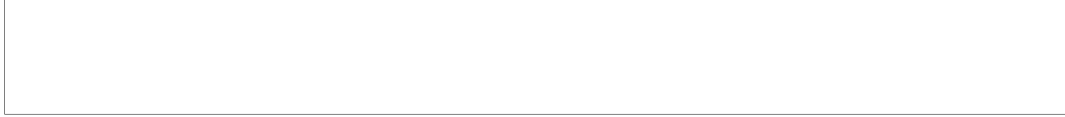

e. Mikhaïlov (fnu). Successor to Yablochkina, representative of Raznoimport.



f. Romin (fnu).<sup>2</sup> Member of the Nonferrous Metals Section of the Trade Delegation since late 1952. Representative of Raznoimport. Dealt with DIA mainly in connection with the import of sheet brass (Messingbleche) to the USSR through the DIA Metall Export Kontor. This sheet brass was produced by Walzwerk fuer Buntmetalle Hettstedt. He was also interested in other nonferrous metal products, including copper wire.



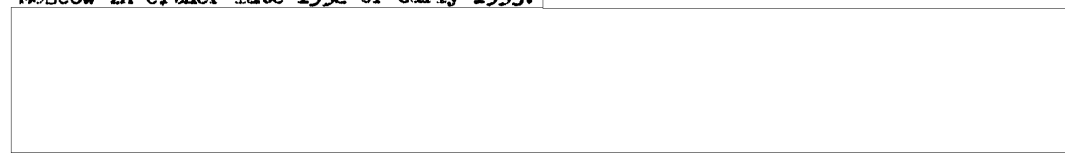

g. Sumkin (fnu). Colleague of Romin's, also a member of the Nonferrous Metals Section of the Trade Delegation. He appeared at the Trade Delegation in 1952, reportedly to replace Feyalib (fnu), and is known to have remained at least through the summer of 1953.

g. Feyalib (fnu). Predecessor of Kamenaki as head of the Nonferrous Metals Section of the Trade Delegation. He represented Raznoimport and dealt with the Export Kontor of DIA Metall. His main interest was in sheet brass from Hettstedt, but he also expressed interest in wire cable and wire mesh. He was recalled to Moscow in either late 1952 or early 1953.

- 2. Romin (fnu) and Sumkin (fnu), as the Nonferrous Metals Import Section of the Trade Delegation, also dealt with DIA Metall, since the Export Kontor of DIA Metall sold sheet brass to the USSR which was manufactured in Hettstedt. There were delays in deliveries of finished products; the Hettstedt plant did not have various raw materials which were needed to manufacture the products required. Romin and Sumkin always demanded extremely favorable prices for the products they purchased; if these prices did not permit a profit to be made, then the East German government had to subsidize the products.

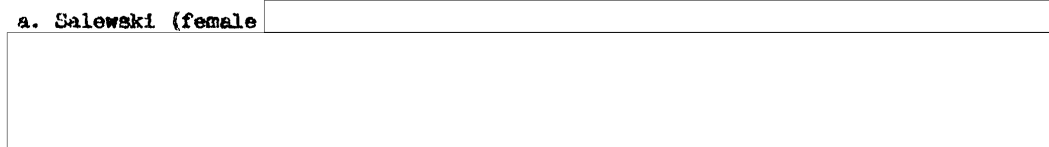

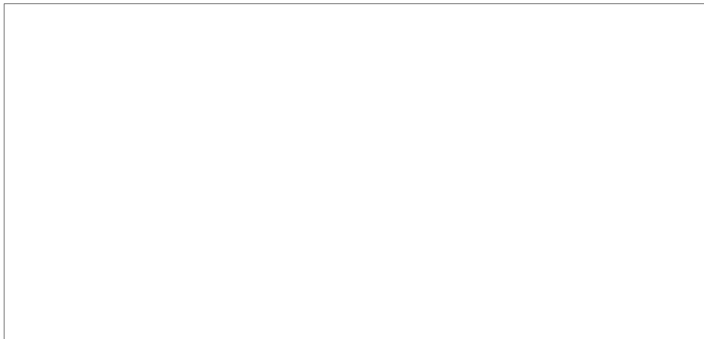

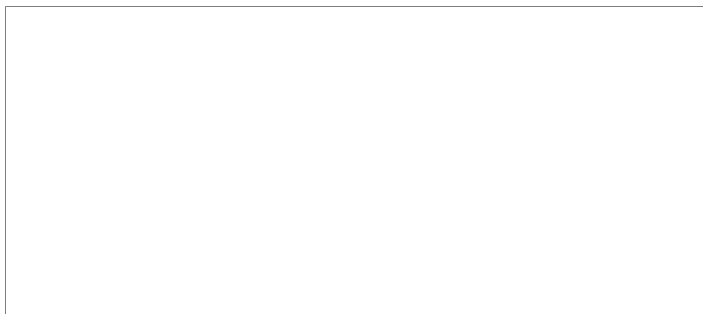
