1. [Redacted] five Soviet trawler-type auxiliary ships were observed at N 57-57, E 19-50. The three larger vessels were equipped with guns, radio, and radar. The other two were smaller vessels and they had only radio equipment. The ships were proceeding in the following formation on a northerly course:
