So far as "normalization" of relations with the USSR is concerned, [REDACTED] there might be a tendency in the lower party cadres to demand a reduction in length of military service or of conscription quotas in order to divert that manpower to the farms and industry. There were a "fair number" of party officials on the lower levels [REDACTED] who were rather convinced that the worst was over so far as the Russians were concerned. These officials did not constitute any policy-making groups [REDACTED] but they were the party officials in local areas who wanted to fortify their position with a sort of "bring-the-boys-home" program.
