This is UNEVALUATED Information

1. Between 0815 and 1330 on 29 November 1954, 28 MiG-15s, 3 Yak-11s and a wrecked Pe-2 were seen at Parndorf airfield. There was no air activity. There was a 8/10 overcast at an altitude of about 1,500 meters, southwesterly wind of about 8 km/h and visibility as far as the Leitha Mountains. Construction work at the field was apparently completed. The AA gun emplacements were occupied by 6 x 37-mm guns and guarded by patrolling sentries. 25X1

2. Twenty-one motor vehicles were parked under the lean-to roofs. Five trucks, including [redacted] tank trucks, [redacted] 3 van-like trucks and 4 Moskovich 25X1
 UNCODED -type van-like trucks were parked in the open. Eight tank trucks were parked at the fuel dump. The ground radio installations were apparently unchanged. Trucks [redacted] all 25X1
 of them with drivers wearing black-bordered blue epaulets were seen in traffic at the field.

3. The air force komendatura in Bruck/Leitha was guarded by a sentry who wore black-bordered blue epaulets. Trucks [redacted] fire 25X1
 truck [redacted] and van-like truck [redacted] all of them with drivers 25X1
 wearing black-bordered blue epaulets, were seen at the installation.

[redacted] Comment. Reconditioning work on buildings and installations at 25X1
 Parndorf airfield was completed. The field is still believed to be occupied by a Soviet fighter regiment (112th Gds).
