1. An airfield constructed by the German Air Force in 1942-1943 was located east of Reghin (4646N-2442E), south of the railroad line to Gurghiu (4647N-2452E) and east of Solovastru railroad station. After the war the airfield was improved by the Soviets. In June 1954 the airfield had a long concrete runway and was occupied by a Soviet unit equipped with turbojet aircraft.¹ 25X1

2. In June 1954, Debrecen airfield (4731N-2139E) was occupied by 30 to 40 twin-engine jet aircraft and a Soviet military unit.²

1. [Redacted] Comment: According to war time records the pinpoint location of Reghin airfield is 4646N-2446E. 25X1

2. [Redacted] Comment: Debrecen airfield is probably occupied by two Soviet bomber regiments. 25X1
