1. [] approximately 340 troops, equipped with 60-mm. mortars and accompanied by dependents, arrived in Juian (N 27-48, E 120-38) from the direction of Pingyang (N 27-40, E 120-34). They were quartered in civilian houses in Kungchihang (0361/3444/5887) near the South Gate of Juian. 25X1
2. [] 120 civilians, including 30 families, arrived in Juian via the Wenchou-Juian ferry. The men wore blue twill Chungshan (0022/1472) uniforms, and the women wore blue Lenin uniforms. Each carried a pistol. After resting at the ferry landing for three hours, the group proceeded toward Pingyang. 25X1
3. [] approximately 400 Public Security troops attired in black uniforms and equipped with 60-mm. mortars, heavy machine guns, and rifles arrived in the coastal area near Aochiangkou (N 27-34, E 120-28). They had come from Hengshan (2897/1472), Juian. 25X1
