1. [Redacted] ship visited Riga in late September 1954, there were many fishing cutters of 30 to 40 tons lying in Riga Bay, and fishing was continually in progress. Two patrol boats lay to seaward beyond the cutters. 25X1
2. In the Muehlengraben Shipyard, one merchant ship was on the ways. [Redacted] the shipyard had some construction ways, as he observed heavy equipment cranes, as well as ordinary cranes of a light type with a long arm. 25X1
3. Near the sawmills on the west side of the Daugava River, there was a large quantity of straw and sawdust. Traffic on the road between the airfield and the river was heavy. Just south of the airfield and toward the river [Redacted] two large installations [Redacted] believed to be cement factories. 25X1
4. [Redacted] many naval personnel in Riga. Houses, streets, and sidewalks in the town were in poor condition. The streetcars, although old fashioned, were always full. The motormen were men and the conductors women. 25X1
