A Soviet university for the furtherance of Czech-Soviet relations was allegedly established in Prague in the fall of 1954. Twenty professors from Moscow were called to the new university. Professor Havranek (fm), who attended the Slavonic conference in Berlin in November 1954, was appointed rector of the university.
