SOURCE EVALUATIONS ARE DEFINITIVE. APPRAISAL OF CONTENT IS TENTATIVE.

1. Soviet diplomats [redacted] believe that their government will consider allowing free elections in Germany only after the activation of a European security system. They do not expect early reunification of Germany, since the U.S.S.R. will insist on the abandonment of American bases in Europe as a prerequisite.
2. It is the opinion of Russians [redacted] that the Geneva Conference should consider only problems capable of a solution, such as disarmament, the prohibition of atomic weapons, and collective security, not difficult problems like the question of a seat in the United Nations for Communist China or German reunification. They think there should be no discussion of the Oder-Neisse boundary, as this is a Polish rather than a Soviet boundary, and any discussion of it requires the participation of the Polish government.<sup>1</sup>
1. Comment: It is reported that the Russians requested the Polish government not to over-emphasize the celebration of the fifth anniversary of the treaty confirming the Oder-Neisse boundary.
