2. Match Factories - There was one factory in Riga, one in Liepaja (Libau). Both produced 79 million boxes for local consumption only.

3. Rubber Plants - There were three plants, all in Riga. In 1938 they used 789 tons of raw caoutchouc (imported raw rubber). They produced:

- 432,813 pairs -- galoshes - overshoes
- 438,472 pairs -- boots
- 867,073 pairs -- rubber shoes
- 188,923 pieces -- cycle tires
- 176,297 pieces -- cycle tubes
- 90,076 meters -- rubber hose
- 404,980 pairs -- rubber heels

and other products mostly for inland market.

4. Wax Cloth Production: 72,223 square meters

- Impregnated textiles -- 30,715 square meters
- Dermatin -- 9,239 square meters

5. Soap and Candles - In 1938 there were 33 large soap factories, of which 30 were in Riga. These 33 factories produced in 1938:

- 2,919 tons ---Laundry soap
- 825 tons -- soft soap
- 267 tons -- toilet soap
- 13 tons -- cosmetic soap
- 14 tons -- medicinal soap

Six factories produced 281 tons candles.

6. Vegetable Oils - Out of 14 largest plants, seven were in Riga. The 14 plants used in 1938:

11,043 tons linseed
 2,556 tons soya beans
 529 tons palm kernels
 1,667 tons copra

7. Fertilizers - Fertilizer production in 1938 was:

115,167 tons - super phosphate
 1,203 tons - Thomas phosphate
 1,994 tons - bone fertilizers

The 1,994 tons of bone fertilizer were produced in three plants in Riga out of 3,901 tons of bones (All Latvia produced about 16 to 20 thousand tons of bones.) Super phosphate was produced at the factory in Milgravis (Muhlgraben) near Riga.

8. Compressed gases were produced in five factories:

9. Casein was produced in one factory at Riga. 826 tons out of the 2,009 tons of new casein supplied by 90 dairies. The plywood plants used 960 tons of casein plus 16 tons imported casein. 82 tons of artificial horn were produced in 1938.
