COST COMPARISON: BLACK & WHITE VS COLOR SEPARATIONS FOR REPORT WORK

DESCRIPTION: A job to be produced has one lay (8-pgges) which contains in one instance a black and white photograph $3x^4$ " and in a comparative instance a color photograph $3x^4$ ".

ASSUMPTIONS FOR CAMERA/LAYOUT

- A. The cost and materials figures for camera and layout assume the use of current procedures and methods. Color separations use film which is twice as expensive as film suitable for back and white. The indirect method for producing separations necessitates the 4 hours in "contact".
- B. It is assumed that proofs would be required on color separation and this cost is included.
- C. The layout figures presume, based on current practice, that for black and white 2 lays (1 text and 1 halftone) would be produced. For color, 5 lays would be required (1 text and 4 separation lays).

 ASSUMPTIONS FOR PRESS
- A. The black and white lays would be double burned producing 1 plate.

 The color lays would not be double burned, hence 5 plates.
- B. Presswork would be accomplished by running separation \mathbf{x} plates on the 2-color press and the text on single color press.

Attached is 25X 1A90st unintelligible draft memo from or somebody on the cost of color versus black and white photos. What it says, basically, is contained in the first paragraph entitled "Description" and the last paragraph entitled "Summary." In addition, 25X1A9 vehemently notes that PSD is not set up to print the Sears & Roebuck catalog, period. If the DDI were to go in for color printing on a large scale would have to get fancy color presses (4 cylinders) and fancy electronic color separators which are both quite expensive. In effect, he says he could handle more color but not a great deal more color for OBGI, where he has lots of lead time, but would be in great straits if OCI were to use any appreciable amount of additional color.
