## MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

## Morning Meeting of 16 August 1966

DD/I reported on recent Soviet attempts to purchase grain from
Canada and France. He reported that
is keeping a close watch on Soviet activities in the world grain market.

DD/I gave the Director a memorandum on the Soviet role in the air defenses of North Vietnam. He noted that the memo concludes that the recent Soviet activity is a stopgap measure on the part of the Soviets rather than an indication of increasing involvement. (See Action 1)

DD/I reported that the State/Defense China Study Group is preparing to do a follow-up to its recent paper and is seeking Agency support. He noted that the Agency had done about two-thirds of the work in preparing the Group's original paper but that only the State and Defense Departments received by-lines. Jacobson of the State Bureau of Far Eastern Affairs will meet today with the DD/I to discuss the follow-up paper. DD/I recommended and the Director agreed that either the Agency should be given credit for its participation or it should limit its support to the Group.
