SUBJECT: Minutes of Meeting of the Special Group, 17 May 1962

PRESENT: General Taylor (Item 9); Mr. Johnson; Mr. McCons; Mr. William Bundy and General Lemnitser

1. Periphersl Beconnaissance

Captain Dankworth and Lt. Colonel Chapman showed the Group results of Missions LARK and FALCON, including the identification of a circular SAM site and a new airfield.

Mr. McCone asked why it had taken so long for the Group to see the results of LANK, which was flown on the 12th of April. It was agreed that there had been much too long a delay.

Captain Dankworth reported that the submarine reconnaissance <u>mounted in connection with CINCLANT's contingency plausing was</u> shat it had occasioned no reaction, and that the beach ermined to be suitable for amphibious operations.

8. Price Figuras in Descial Group Presentations

Mr. Parrott said that General Taylor had had some questions as to the extent to which the Special Group actually approves financial figures for the projects which come bafore it. After some discussion, it was agreed that the function of the Group is to give policy approval and that, while it is necessary to approach such approvals with knowledge of the general order of magnitude of the particular project, . the Group should mat attempt to pass on the detailed builder of cost figures for each project. It was agreed that minor deviations from the estimated figure would not require resubmission to the Group, but that this would mornally be done in the evept that a large discrepancy develops.

9. Chinese Nationalist Plans for the Mainland

Dr. Cline explained the background of the recent wessage from Chiang Kai-shek. As a corollary to this, he commented on the increased flow of Chinese refugees into Hong Kong and said the Generalissimo believes that this indicates a breakdown of the communist security system.

He said that we must take Chiang Kai-shek seriously at this stage, and that he detected an attitude on the part of the Metionalists which goes well beyond their views on a possible immusion of the mainland, which they have held for the past several years. The Generalissimo had emphasized that the United States would have to treat the Mationalists with respect, and could not attempt to impose its will on them in all impose its will on the in all impose at what he viewed as undue financial presence.

Dr. Cline said that he wanted to clarify exactly what Chiang Kaiourk since in some quarters in Washington his remarks had been interpreted as a threat to move against the mainland, with or without C.S. support. What he had actually said was that he had agreed to postpone any such decision for six months; however, it appeared to Chiang Kai-shek that perhaps some elements in the U.S. wanted him to postpone action forever. He had poi ed out that he is willing to cooperate with the U.S., but that he must have something to show his own people to convince them that cooperation with the U.S. is worthwhile.
