Thank you for your letter of 23 May to Mr. Echols on behalf of Mr. [redacted]

We can appreciate Mr. [redacted] desire to learn specifically why he was not employed by us in 1961. The simple fact is, however, that there were no specific factors which taken alone led to the decision that he did not fully meet our overall standards of employment. These standards are necessarily broad and go beyond the question of an applicant's ability to perform a particular job. They include such factors as health, stability, character, and reputation, as well as intellectual abilities, aptitudes, training, and experience.

Mr. [redacted] was considered for a position as a Communications Technician (Cryptographic). In this field of work, it is important that our employees be fully qualified technically and that they be equipped to serve in all parts of the world under varying conditions of stress and hardship. In our overall assessment of Mr. [redacted], we concluded that he did not measure up to the total requirements for such employment.

As a result of your inquiry, we have reviewed Mr. [redacted]'s file to determine if there were any possibility of a different conclusion if he were again considered for such employment. However, there appears to be no reason to believe that the general factors which influenced our earlier decision would have changed materially in the 10 or so months which have elapsed.
