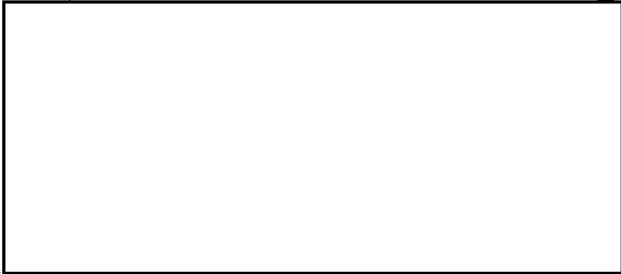

May I express to you my appreciation and extend warmest wishes in the years ahead.

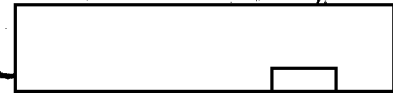
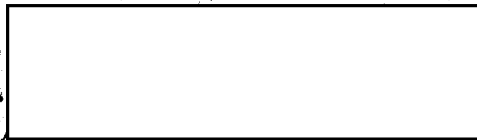
