SUBJECT : All-out intelligence effort against Communist China

REFERENCE:

1. The Director has instructed the undersigned to pull together a comprehensive plan of action for intelligence collection against Communist China, utilizing all possible intelligence resources both within and outside CIA.

2. Among the specific actions to be taken are:

a. The DD/I should insure that priority requirements on China are reviewed, and that the collectors have the benefit of the latest views of the intelligence community in this regard.

50X1 b. The DD/I, in close collaboration with the DD/R, should present to the Director a list of suggested panelists in the scientific field to be brought to Washington for a week's review of Chinese Communist scientific and technical capabilities. The DCI has indicated he would like a list of about 25 names such as [redacted] and that the panel work in a similar fashion to the Hyland Panel.

50X1 c. Both the DD/I and DD/P should lay on a program for the comprehensive questioning [redacted] about the capabilities of the Chinese Communists in their fields.

d. A brief synopsis of the present state of our knowledge about Chinese Communist scientific and technical capabilities should be prepared by the DD/I for the DCI.

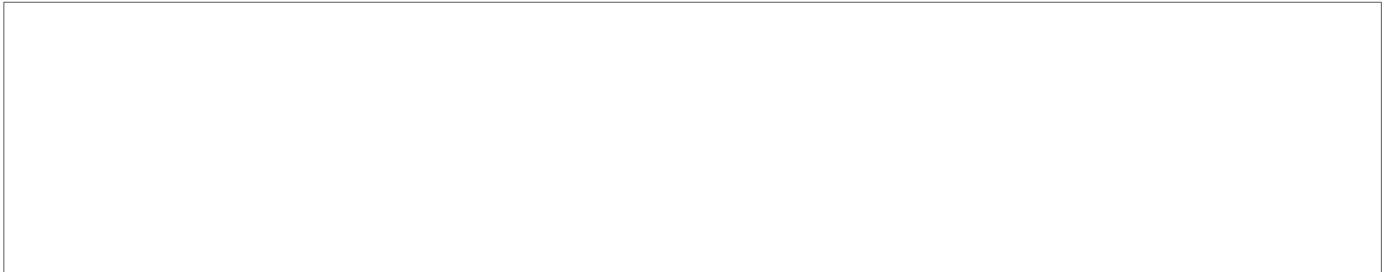
