Reports by Members

- (a) The Chairman reported on a two-hour session at Department of State with Norvell Jones, Chief Counsel of the Congressiona subcommittee on surveillance. Jones stated his interest in the physical and technical surveillance of Americans in the United States and abroad. His specific questions, however, ranged to surveillance of foreigners in the US and to national security leaks. The Chairman commented that Mr. Jones appeared to be on a "fishing" expedition and recommended that the TSCC maintain a low profile, even though the Committee, being primarily interested in defensive measures, would probably not be bothered.
- (b) The Chairman reported briefly on the present state of DCID 1/11 which delineates the future staffing and responsibilities of the TSCC. The draft directive is still in the Security Committee, held up by intra-CIA problems with disposition of certain of the directive's responsibilities.
