SUBJECT : Final Details

1. As I explained to one of your helpful secretaries, in the maps delivered to you this morning (18 November) there were a few minor printing errors discovered at about 0400 and corrected by hand so we could meet your noon deadline. The maps are being rerun from corrected plates. Three corrected sets with all corrections made in the plates from which they were printed will be sent down to your office by special courier at about 2000 tonight. Each of these will have clipped to its cover a small piece of white paper that says "corrected." I would suggest you destroy the first set and substitute these corrected copies.

2. The corrections are all minor and, as indicated, have been made by hand on the copies you now have. Consequently, a study of these will not mislead you or Henry. There will be no substantive change in the presentation. I am sending the revised versions primarily because I do not like anything to come out of this Agency that is not letter perfect.

3. We sent down yesterday afternoon (17 November) the intelligence collection package that Henry asked for at the 15 November WSAG. My intention is to distribute copies of this on Monday (20 November) to the WSAG principals (save for Sullivan, who will be with you) plus the Secretary of Defense and the Directors of DIA and NSA. If you or Henry would prefer
