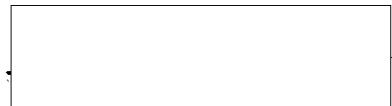

2. The headquarters personnel consisted of approximately 250 enlisted men and NCO's, and about 50 commissioned officers. The commanding officer was Lieutenant Colonel (fau) Pap, [ ]
3. The AAA division was composed of four regiments, three of them stationed in Dunafold, Vac, Ercs and a fourth in a location unknown to me. Every regiment had five batteries, but I am not able to furnish detailed information on the organizational breakdown of these batteries.
4. At the Matyas Kaserne, there was only one teletype machine of foreign make. It was used by three operators in three shifts to maintain communications with the headquarters of the various military installations throughout Hungary. Most of our contacts were made with Dunafold AAA regimental headquarters through a direct circuit. Communications with other stations could only be established by requesting the proper circuit from the Ministry of Defense.
5. Messages sent by teletype consisted of clear routine military operational or administrative orders, or coded messages of a classified nature. In addition, two B#20 type radio sets were also used to maintain communications with the various units.
6. There was an officers candidate school in the Matyas Kaserne, where approximately 100 to 120 officers were trained yearly. Courses taught consisted of radar, radio communications, anti aircraft tactics, AA guns, etc. Classes usually started in February and ended in May of each year.

On file [ ] is an overlay showing the exact location of Matyas Kaserne in Budapest, classified CONFIDENTIAL.

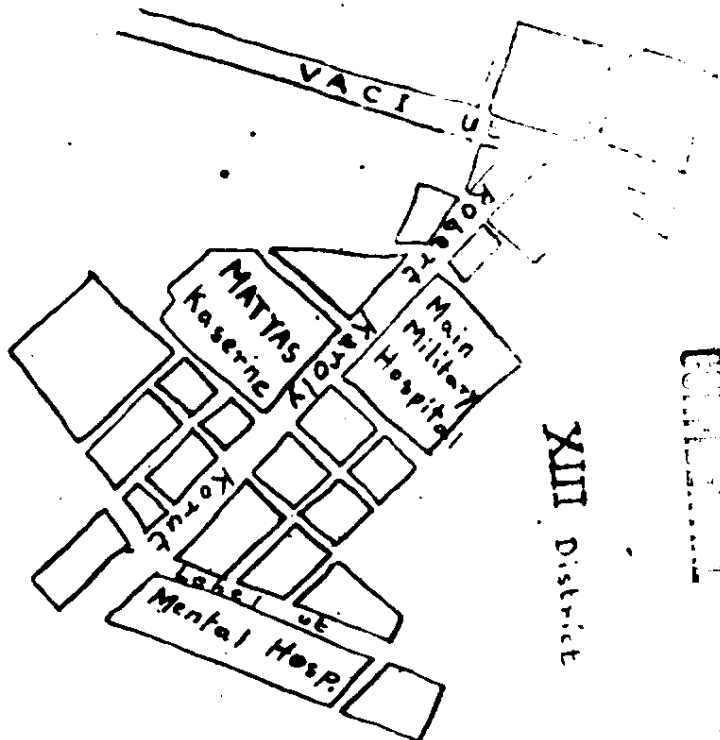
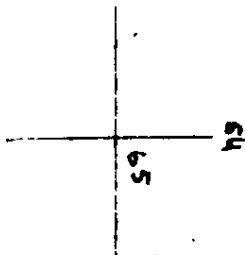
