1. Air Bases

[redacted] Shebetovka (N 44-55, E 35-10) to Simferopol in 1951 [redacted] the following air bases as identified numerically on Overlay of Crimea, page 3:

50X1-HUM

1. Along the Simferopol - Yevpatoriya highway, approximately five kilometers from Yevpatoriya (N 45-10, E 33-22), north of the highway, [redacted] a jet bomber air base. [redacted] the aircraft were twin-engine jet bombers. 50X1-HUM
2. [redacted] airfields on both sides of the Simferopol-Sevastopol highway, approximately three kilometers from Simferopol. [redacted] twin-engine jet bombers and single-engine jet fighter aircraft. 50X1-HUM
3. On the Simferopol - Feodosiya (N 45-05, E 35-25) highway, north of the Simferopol-Feodosia - Krymskoye Primore (N 44-55, E 35-12) highway junction [redacted] a jet fighter air base. [redacted] there were more than 100 single-engine jet fighters on the field, some of which were coated with a plastic substance for storage purposes. 50X1-HUM

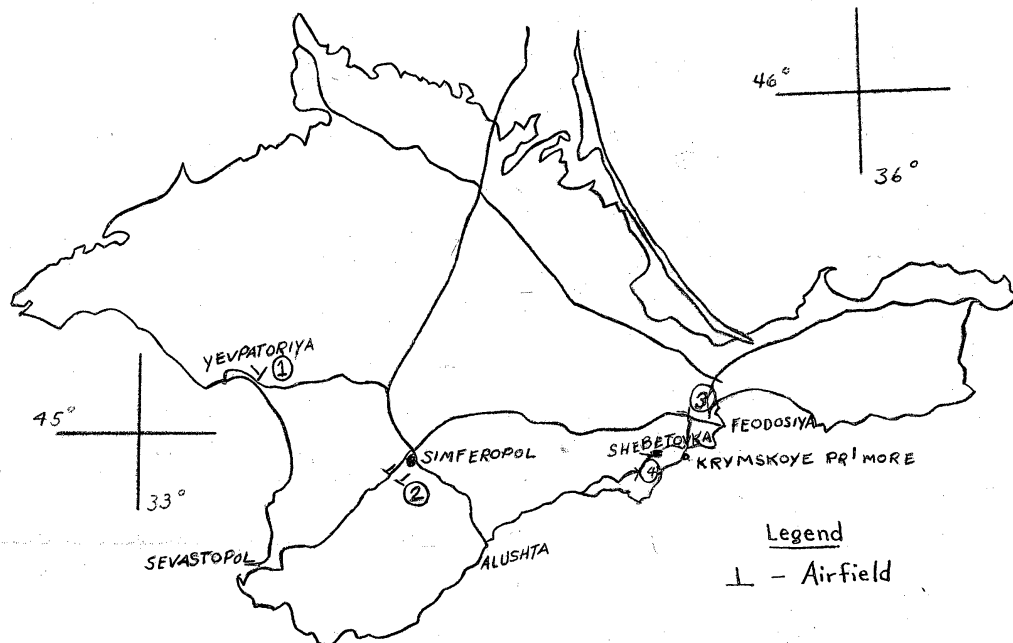
[redacted] the coastal town of Krymskoye Primore [redacted] 50X1-HUM
 construction project located three to five kilometers west of Shebetovka along the Shebetovka-Alushta (N 44-45, E 34-25) road. [redacted]
 [redacted] there were two separate projects in the same area. [redacted]
 [redacted] approximately 150 forced laborers were engaged in digging a tunnel into a pyramid-shaped mountain, and fifty forced laborers were constructing a large steel-reinforced concrete platform level with the tunnel entrance. 50X1-HUM
 [redacted] this was to be a guided missile launching site, whose ultimate target would be Turkey. [redacted]
