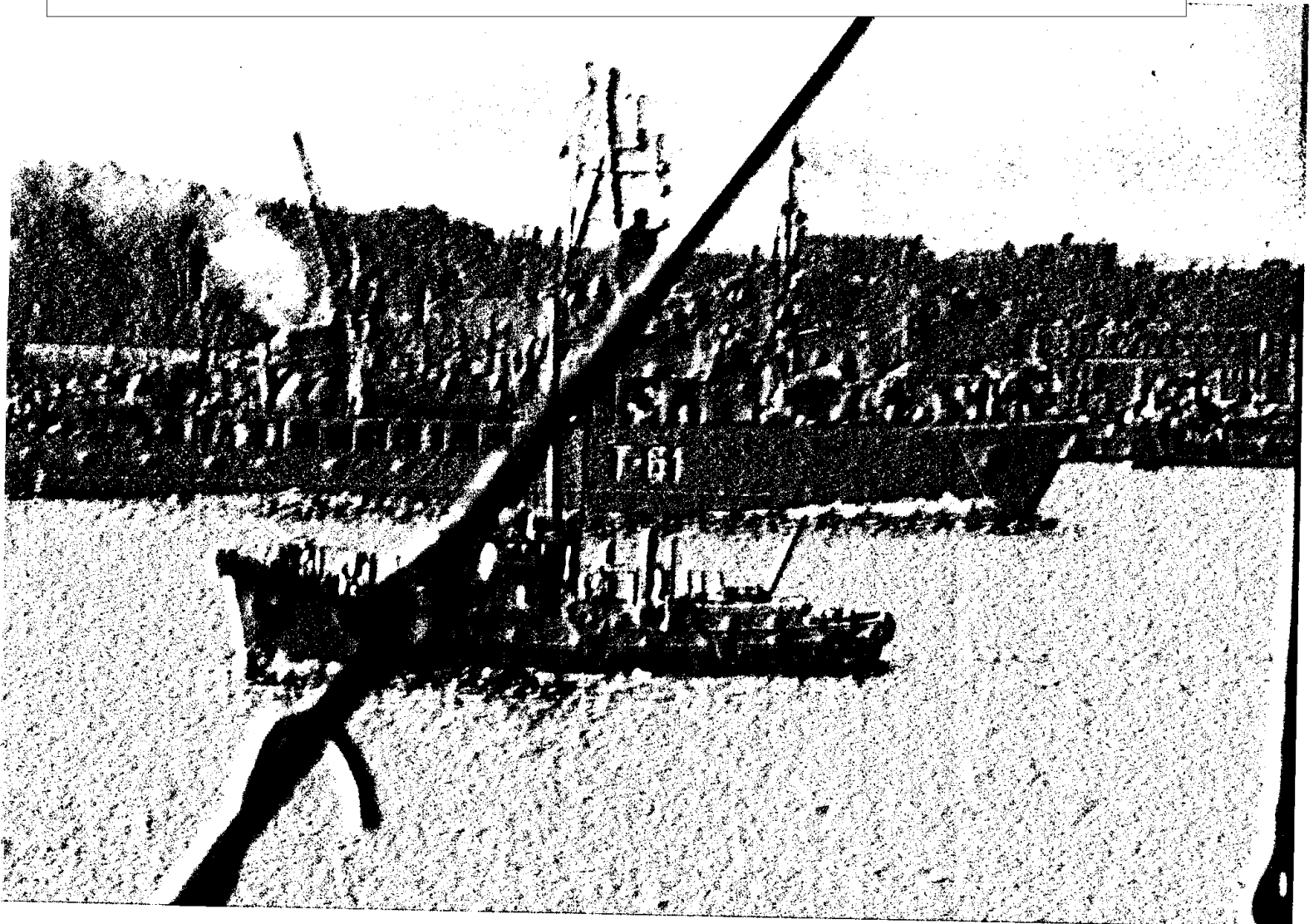

T-43 CLASS SUB-CHASER

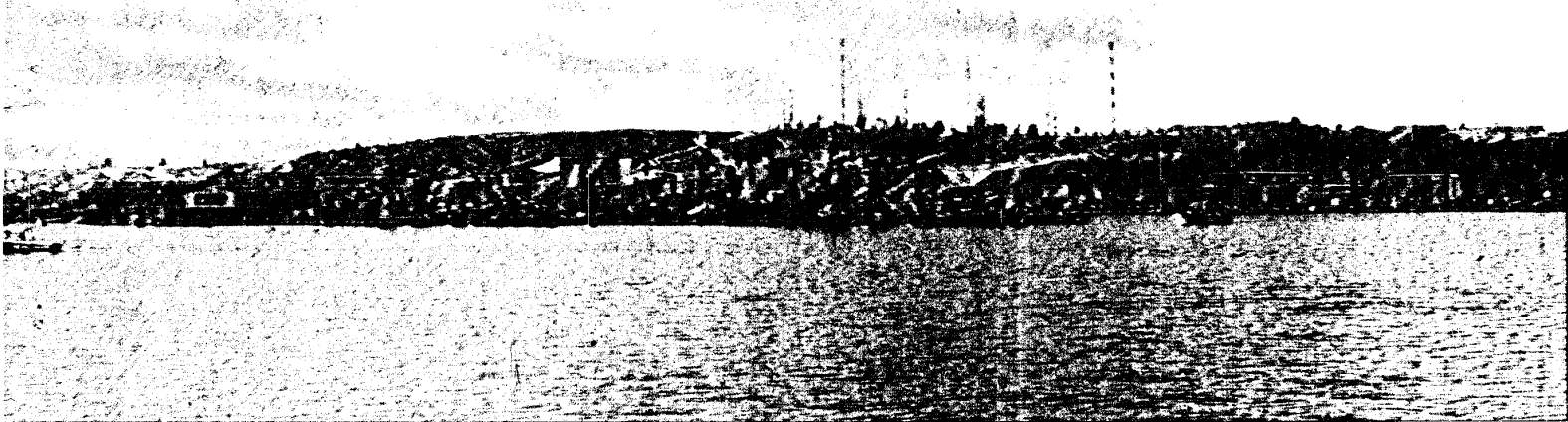

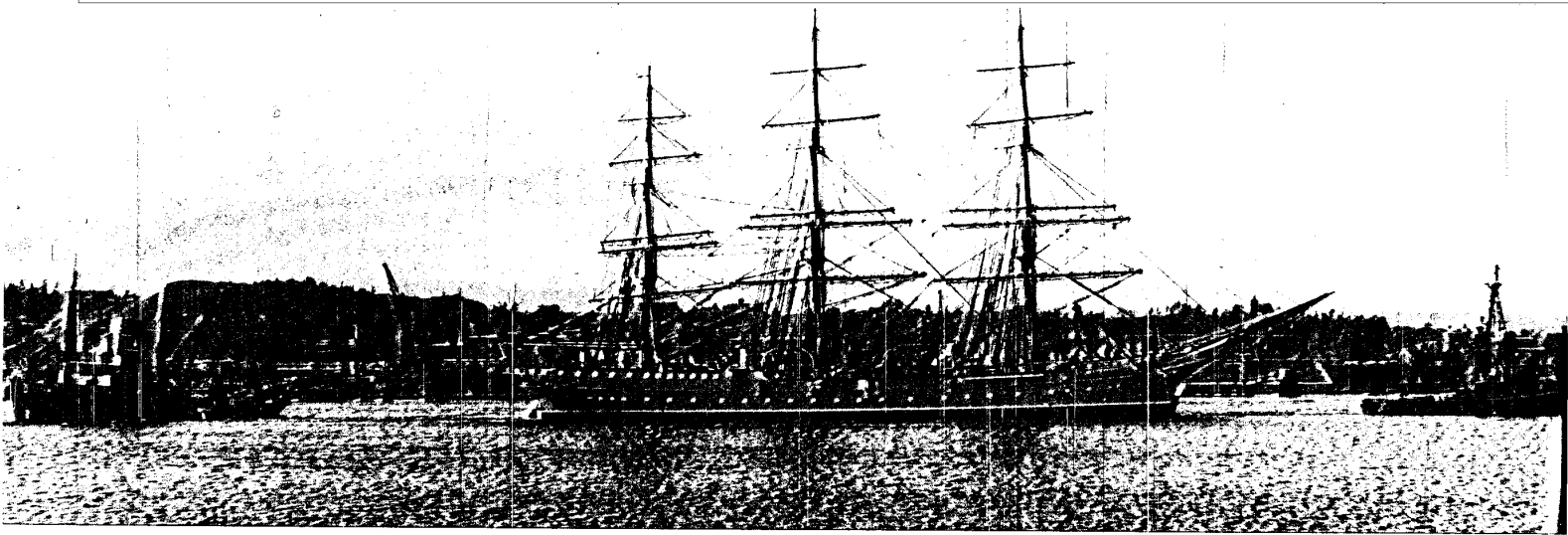
