Gross Doelln airfield which give information on flight activities and a pipe line which extends from Jagen 133 (Kurtschlag) to the airfield. Two sketches are also included, one shows the location of the pile-line stopcocks, and the other shows how pipes were flanged in some sections.

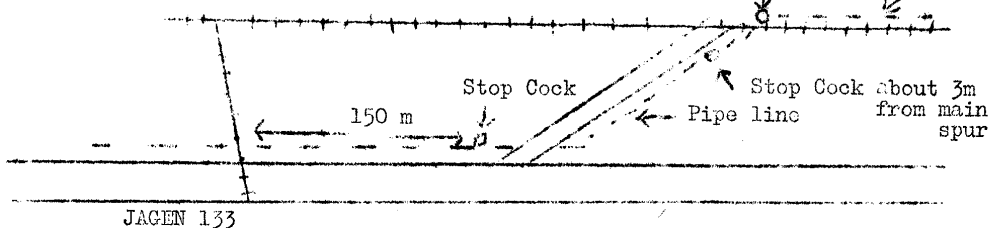

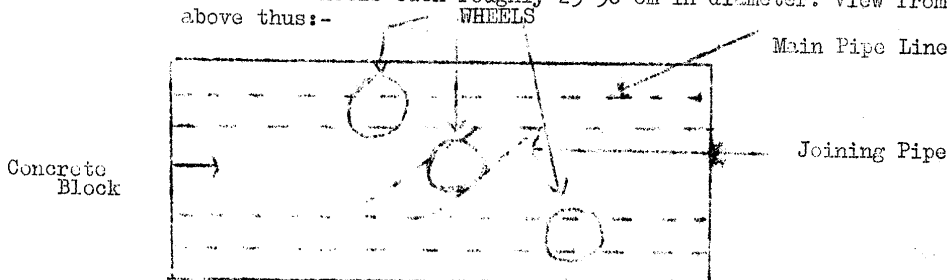
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1. (a) Fuel dump in Jagén 133 (KURTSCHLAG)

- (i) The dump has not yet been completed and Germans are working on the site.
- (ii) A stop cock is located 150 m East of the point where the site railway spur crosses the road VOGELSANG - KURTSCHLAG and North of this road. Stop cocks are encased into concrete blocks which protrude about 50 cm above earth and measure about 3m x 3m.
- (iii) Two stop cocks are located immediately North and South of main airfield railway line at the point where the fuel dump pipe line goes underneath main railway line thus:- Stop Cock Pipe line



Two pipe lines which are lying side by side are joined together by a small piece of piping which is about 16cm dia. On top of both main pipes and also on top of the joining pipe there are wheels each roughly 25-30 cm in diameter. View from above thus:-



(b) Main pipe line

As has already been stated in para (a) (iii) above, the main pipe line passes underneath main railway spur and thence North of and parallel to spur to airfield, as the pipe line nears the airfield it branches off slightly NE and away from the railway spur finally entering airfield perimeter at about MR VU 000763, inside the perimeter the pipe line runs further NE to approx. MR VU 004764 - i.e. - up to NNE/SSW taxi track - but not yet through it.

- (c) The village of GRÜNEWALD will be evacuated by German civilians sometime in the future.

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Flying Activity1. (a) 23 June

Time:- 2030-2200 hrs

Cloud:- 4/10ths at 1000m height.

Aircraft:- 4 x MIG 17 took off and flew up to height above clouds. A/C seen later singly circling airfield.

(b) 25 June

Time: - 1500 hrs

Cloud:- 9/10ths at 2000m height

A single jet aircraft took off from airfield and rose above cloud.

(c) 28 June

Time:- 1000-1100 hrs

Cloud:- 3/10ths at 2000m height

A formation of 3 x single jet aircraft in line abreast took off from airfield and flew underneath cloud ceiling.

Pipe line Jagen 133 (KURTSCHLAG) to airfield.

2. (a) There are 16 stop cocks along this route. Of this total 10 are complete. Whereas all stop cocks are built into a square shaped concrete housing the one nearest the airfield perimeter is built into a circular concrete housing of 2m diameter. Stop cocks are on an average 500-600m apart.
- (b) The pipe line has not yet been completely covered in.
- (c) Pipe sections are each approximately 4m long. About 50% are welded together and 50% are flanged. Wherever sections were flanged, a piece of vertical piping approximately 1.20m high is placed in the ground between the two actual pipe lines. About  $\frac{1}{3}$  of the way up the vertical piece of piping a metal rim is fixed and from the metal rim two wires lead off (each approximately 2cm diameter), one being fixed to each pipe line.

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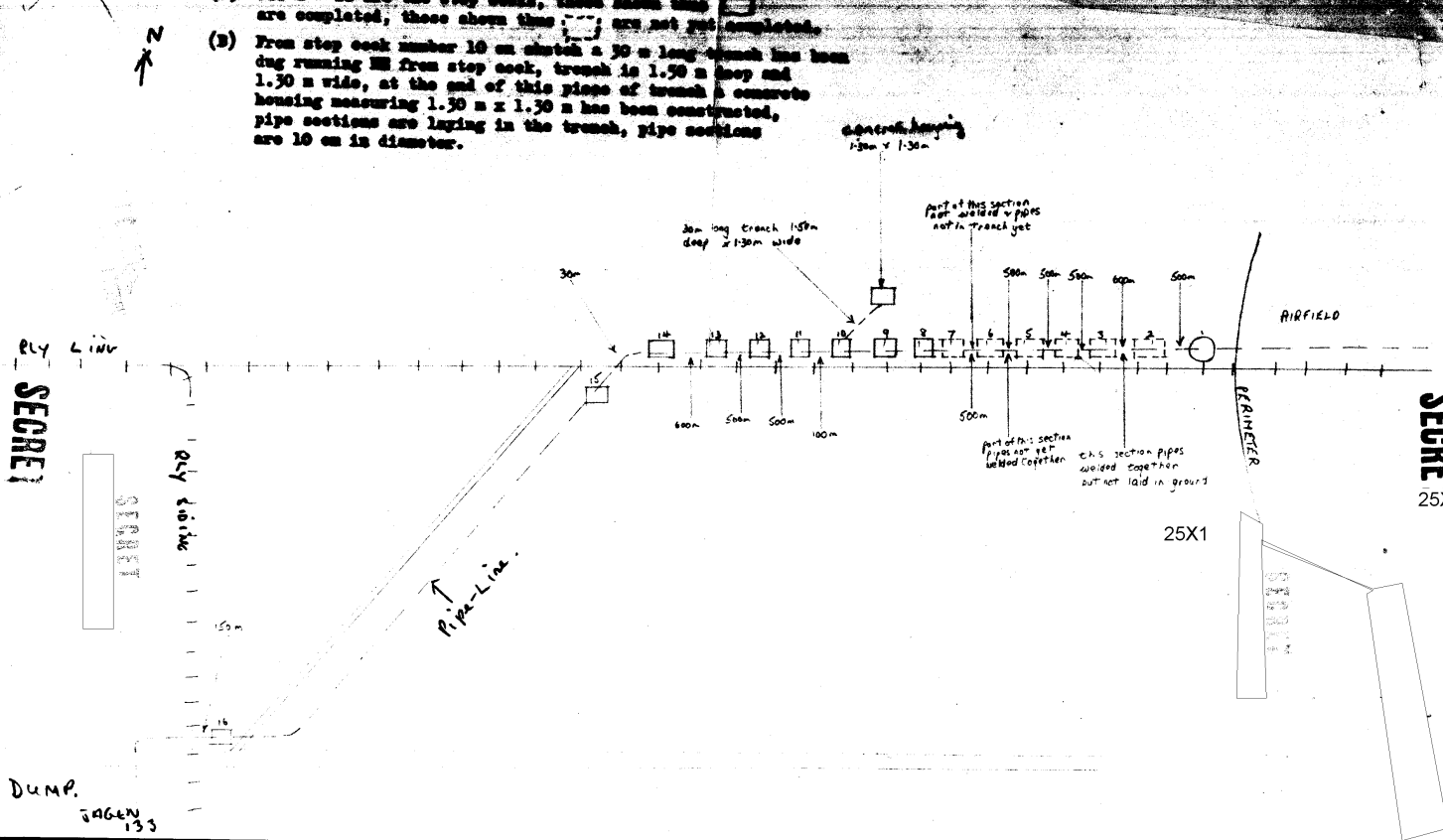
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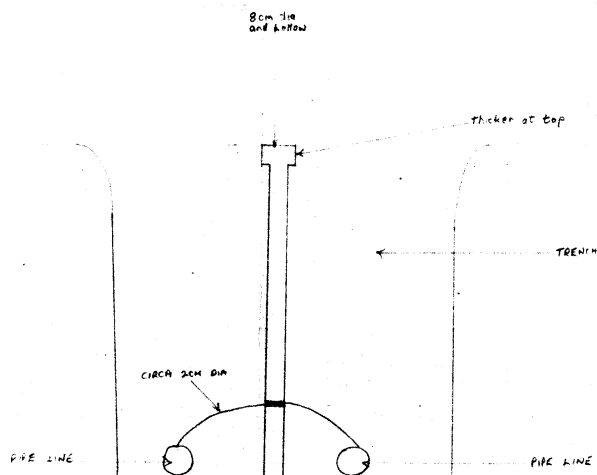
- Legend**
- (A) Nos 1 - 16 are the step coaks, those shown thus [ ] are completed, those shown thus [ ] are not yet completed.
  - (B) From step coak number 10 on sketch a 30 m long trench has been dug running NE from step coak, trench is 1.50 m deep and 1.50 m wide, at the end of this piece of trench a concrete housing measuring 1.50 m x 1.50 m has been constructed, pipe sections are laying in the trench, pipe sections are 10 cm in diameter.
