### Redic Saved Inerd Holotova

In 1950, there were two radio fasteries in Hinsk: the Radio Raved Inent Heletova and the Hinski Radio Raved (the name of the former was changed after the denotion of Heletov but it was not known). The Radio Saved Inent Heletova was the former Electric Plant, which had been transferred to Hinsk from Vilnius in 1939, at which time it was remand. The plant was completely destroyed during World War II, but was reconstructed immediately after the war and recomed regular production in 1966. It was lecated on the right-hand side (viewed from the center of town) of prospekt Stalin, the main thoroughfure of Hinsk (street number unknown). The plant consisted of several

interconnected buildings which in effect formed one threestory structure, with in interior yard.

- 2. Until 1950, the Radio Zavod Imeni Molotova produced popularpriced radio sets only, namely the Pioner, Minsk, and Belorus.

  In August 1950, a number of technical and administrative
  employees, as well as a considerable number of workers, were
  dismissed; almost all of those affected were persons who
  had not held Soviet nationality prior to 1939. At the same
  time, the plant was converted into a secret one, and the main
  production effort was switched over to secret appliances,
  apparently military radio equipment, while the radio sets
  became accessory production items (no details on the new
  products or as to whether the plant bore a designation number).
- 3. The plant had five or six meetions, including a mechanical shop, an assembly shop, a carpentry shop, and a galvanizing section. The total staff was about 1,500, mostly women, including about 100 engineers and technicians. Except for the mechanical shop, the plant operated in one shift. The mechanical shop worked in two shifts.

#### Minski Radio Zavod

in Minsk, was begun in 1951 under the direction of David
Lvovich Yudelevich. An engineer and economist, Yudelevich
had been director general of Radio Zavod Imeni Molotova
from 1939 to 1951, exclusive of the war years. The plant
was believed to manufacture only radio sets for civilian use,
including the Belorus type, and television sets. Judging
from its outside (no description), the factory seemed larger
than Radio Zavod Imeni Molotova. It was also located almost
in the center of town (no details).

## Instrumentalniy Zavod Imeni Chkalova

5. The Instrumentalniy Zavod Imeni Chkalova, a tools factory in the center of Minsk (no information on exact address) had been operating under the same name and at the same location since before World War II. In mid-1957, it employed 500 to 600 persons and consisted of three buildings, two of which were ground floor structures and one one-story. The factory comprised a forge, a mechanical shop, and a hardening shop.



The mechanical shop, the largest unit of the factory, had 10-12 machines, the most powerful of which was a 70-ton press.

6. The products of the Instrumentalniy Zavod Imeni Chkalova were destined for the local metal and plastics industry; they consisted of dies, casting molds, and other work applicances (no details).

- 1. The Mechanical Plant of the Ministry of State Farms
  (Makhamichaskiy Zavod Ministerstva Sovichosov) in Seratov /N 51-34,
  E 46-027 was located at 109 Chernishevskiy Street. Until its
  transfer to this ministry in 1955, the factory had been subordinate
  to the Ministry of Heavy Industry. The factory was snong those
  which had been swacuated from Orekhovo at the outbreak of the war
  and which had remained in Seratov ever since.
- 2. The factory, employing about 600 workers, serviced the machinery belonging to the state farms of the RSFSR. It mainly produced motors for mobile power stations used in agriculture;


