

- 1. Sports field
- 2. Headquarters for naval divers; this consists of three one-story brick buildings enclosed in a barbwire fence.
  - 3. Storage area for herring barrels
  - 4. Lumber yard area.
  - 5. Aerial ponton supply, with four pontons
- 6. A wooden barrakks building in which valves and locking devices are manufactured for emergency fire extinguishing equipment
- 7. An old foundry building in which copper, bronze, and other castings are made; the building is a wooden barracks.
- 8. An unfinished ship building yard, construction of which was begun by the Germans; it is not being used; a storage area for highly inflammable materials is located under it.
- 9. A repair yard for torpedo boats, currently in use; the yard can accomodate for ten torpedo boats at a time, of which four can be placed inside the repair shop.
  - 10. An oiling warf that can accomodate one vessel at a time
  - 11. Underground oil pipes
  - 12. Central heating plant consisting of a one story stone building
- 13. Compressor plant consisting of a one story brick building; for compressed air tanks are located adjacent to it
  - 14. Underground gasoline and oil storage
- 15. A 5-story main building containing, among other things, a drafting office, the director's office, the main engineer's office, the main bookkeeper's office, a conference room, and an electrical/storage. In addition



to the offices of director Jasinski and the chief engineer

there is on the first floor the office of

the local communist party First Secretary Sikorski. The office of chief bookkeeper Masepowa is located on the third floor. There are offices on the priphery of the building and work shops in the center of the building.

- 16. A mess halliin a wooden barracks
- 17. A three story brick warehouse building
- 18. A brick construction shop in which woodworking and plastic items are made as well as boat sails. River cruizing motor boats have been made in it for the Polish militia. The speed of the boats is 26 knots and the Lublin make of gasoline engines are used in them. The boats are 4 meters long and carry 4 persons.
  - 19. Two wooden barracks containing the iron and steel supplies
  - 20. Financial administration building, a single-story brick building
- 21. Office building for the shippard, a single-story brick building. The cashier's office and the employment office are located in this building.
- 22. Main warehouse for engines and other similar components. This is a one-story brick building, but there is another floor underground.
  - 23. Engine repair shop, a new brick building
- 24. A new foundry that was completed a month and a half ago. This is a two-story brick building.
- 25, 26, and 27. Several wooden barracks used for housing military personnel

- 28. Cross bar assa and guards at entrance to the naval base
- 29. Restaurant; a two story building plastered on the outside
- 30. The officer's club which is open to the workers of the shipyard.
- This is a two-story brick building plastered on the outside
  - 31. Motion picture theater; a brick building
- 32. Officers' quarters; a three-story building plastered on the outside
  - 33. Sports field
  - 34. Guard building; a one-story wooden building
- 35. A three-story brick building in which torpedos and marine mines are produced
  - 36. Narrow gage railroad bridge
  - 37. Trade school; a four story brick building
  - 38. Adult education school; a four-story brick building
  - 39. Fire department
  - 40. Barracks area for anti-aircraft troops
  - 41. Bentry box built of brick
- 42. Wooden guard tower, about 6 meters high, with guard posted 24 hours a day
  - 43. Underground explosives storage

44. Military airfield inclosed in a heavy board fence.

There may be

about 40 Soviet MIG aircraft on the field bearing Polish insignia.

45. Military motor vehicle park inclosed in a barbwire fence. There are three two-story brick buildings in the area.

- 46. Coal storage area for the shipyard
- 47. An underground fuel oil storage inclosed in a masonry wall; it has a capacity of 12,000 tons of fuel oil
  - 48. Transformer
  - 49. Steam generating plant
  - 50. Radio station with antenna
  - 51. Terminal station of the trolley bus line
  - 52. Officer's school; a five-story brick building
  - 53. Main guard building
  - 54. Torpedo warehouse; a two-story brick building
  - 55. A three-story building, perhaps some kind of a warehouse
- 56. A Polish radio jamming station located in an old German bunker, which is inclosed in a masonry wall and barbwire fence.
