Office of Personnel Briefing Paper on DetaileesI. Introduction:

In common with other agencies of the Federal Government, CIA has a policy which permits the detail of its employees to other agencies for certain established purposes. The detail of Agency personnel is approved only when the assignment is determined to be beneficial to the career development of the individual or it can make a temporary contribution to a foreign intelligence-related activity. Details are not made to enable the receiving agency to avoid appropriations limitations established by the Congress or the personnel ceilings administered by OMB. Employees normally continue to receive their Agency entitlements during the detail. Reimbursement to the Agency depends on the individual circumstances of each detail, i.e., reimbursement when the employee performs Agency-related duties, is a participant in the joint operation of a National Program, is assigned as part of a career development plan, or non-reimbursement when the employee functions totally in a program of the receiving agency.

The detail of Agency personnel to other Government agencies is governed by the provisions of [REDACTED] and the instructions for processing contained in [REDACTED]. The Director of Personnel is the officer responsible for liaison with other agencies for details in or out of CIA and for preparation

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of a written agreement, to include all governing provisions, which effects the detail. Any new or special financial arrangements are coordinated with the Director of Finance. No details are effected without proper coordination with appropriate officials in the agency of assignment.

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III. Rationale by Category:

A. President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board

CIA provides the Staff Assistant to the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board at the request of the Board.

B. National Security Council

- Clerical

CIA is one of the sources for secretarial staffing to the NSC structure in the White House. The Agency is reimbursed for these employees. One of the principal reasons for the Council's request is the existence of a large number of competent secretaries in the Agency who are already cleared for classified information.

- Watch Officers

By request from the White House, it has become traditional for the CIA to staff the White House Situation Room. The practice began many years ago because the Agency had at that time developed an Operations Center (Watch Office), trained a cadre of Watch Officers, and operated the Center on a 24-hour basis.

- Staff Officers

The CIA has for many years furnished the NSC structure in the White House with staff assistance on specific request. The number is usually quite small, and they generally rotate through this assignment since it has proven to be a career developmental assignment.

C. National War College

Since the early 1950's the CIA, among other agencies and departments, has on request from the NWC periodically, as applicable, helped the NWC with specific seminar discussions, etc. The Agency has generally been accorded two spaces in the student body. This relationship proved to be so successful that the NWC asked the Agency to provide a full-time instructor, usually in the field of economics and occasionally in a geographic specialty such as the Middle East.

D. Department of State

The Agency has a close association with other Intelligence Community analytical components, if only because of the salutary effect of interaction between analysts on the Community's intelligence product. In some cases the Director, INR (the State Department's Intelligence Bureau) has asked for the rotational detail of certain analysts by name, often as a result of reputation. The Agency is generally reimbursed.

The Foreign Service Institute often requests the temporary assignment of a qualified specialist to aid in teaching the curriculum. The Agency is reimbursed.

Publications Procurement - The Agency has furnished a specialist in publications procurement on request on a reimbursable basis. The incumbent is due for replacement by a State employee in the very near future.

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Developmental Detail - Over the years the Agency has by mutual agreement with the Department of State sometimes had a qualified employee on a rotational assignment in a research position in the Department's Policy and Coordination Group. This is considered a career development experience.

E. Department of Defense

Appropriate departments and agencies each maintain a presence in the National Military Command Center for liaison and for the purpose of expediting the proper flow of critical intelligence within the Government's national security community.

Special Assignment - The Secretary of Defense asked for this senior Agency employee by name in connection with the Government's negotiations with the USSR and NATO on Mutually Balanced Force Reductions. He is paid by DOD.

Defense Intelligence Agency - The Agency has a professional association with other components of the Intelligence Community.

One of the three assignments is the result of a CIA-DIA exchange program for the improvement of intelligence analysis and the career development of the analysts. The second is on assignment to prepare DIA for the turnover to DIA of the Agency's Joint

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[REDACTED] The third individual is on a three month detail coordinating format changes in the National Intelligence Bulletin.

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NSA - Two SIGINT analysts detailed to NSA slots in a National Program at the request of NSA. Reimbursed by NSA.

F. Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency

This individual is loaned on a leave-without-pay basis to DARPA for one year to assist in the development of computer systems to support intelligence analysis.

G. Department of the Army

This individual in the Army Transport Service is a member of the Agency's Office of Personnel, Central Processing Branch assigned to assist in servicing Category Z (military)

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H. Naval Intelligence/Scientific Center

This individual is an equipment technician assigned to the Center on a reimbursable basis who keeps the machinery running to expedite the flow of intelligence.

I. United States Intelligence Board (USIB), the Guided Missile and Astronautics Intelligence Committee (GMAIC)

GMAIC is one of several standing committees of USIB. CIA has historically provided the Secretariat for this committee. The four detailees are the Secretariat.



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J. Department of the Treasury

The Assistant Secretary of the Treasury for National Security Affairs made a direct request to CIA for staff assistance on a reimbursable basis. There are four employees currently assigned, one in an overlap status pending the return of another this September.

K. National Security Agency

This employee is on non-reimbursable detail in liaison slot.

L. Department of the Air Force

This employee provides necessary liaison for the benefit of CIA-USAF intelligence projects.

M. Department of the Navy

This employee is an industrial economist on non-reimbursable detail to the U. S. Navy. This is a personnel exchange program with the Navy on naval intelligence matters on a one-for-one basis.

N. National Programs

Department of the Navy and Department of the Air Force

Two separate joint programs involving CIA positions assigned to these programs.
