25X1 1. [redacted] Called John Martiny, General Counsel, House Post Office and Civil Service Committee, to determine the status of H. R. 1281, a bill protecting the constitutional rights of Federal employees, which is scheduled for markup 12 September by the Subcommittee on Retirement and Employee Benefits, House Post Office and Civil Service Committee. The bill grants the FBI, NSA and CIA an exemption from section (a) which establishes all of the rights to employees. This is the same exemption as granted in a similar bill introduced last Congress by Representative James Hanley (D., N. Y.), former Chairman of the Subcommittee. Martiny assured me that the exemption from section (a) is in effect a total exemption. He is concerned about an amendment by Representative Morris Udall (D., Ariz.) requiring agencies to report on their implementation of the bill. He (Martiny) will follow the bill closely and suggested if we have comments we hold them for the full Committee.

25X1 2. [redacted] who was referred by the office of Representative David C. Treen (R., La.), returned my call and we rescheduled her personnel interview which was to be for today at 1400 hours to Tuesday, 10 September, at 1400 hours. 25X1 I contacted [redacted] and so informed them.

6. [Redacted] Informed Phyllis Bacon, Assistant Chief Clerk, Senate Armed Services Committee, that the letter to Chairman John C. Stennis (D., Miss.) on S. 2597 and S. 3767 was held up in OMB and that OMB is sending copies to the Department of Justice and the National Security Council. Miss Bacon said she would pass this information to Clark McFadden, General Counsel, Senate Armed Services Committee.

8. [Redacted] Chief, WH Division, reported that State representatives had requested access to the Director's 22 April 1974 testimony on Chile before the Nedzi Subcommittee on Intelligence, House Armed Services Committee. Since access is controlled by the Committee, I informally sounded out Bill Hogan, of the Committee staff, who confirmed that access would be controlled by Chairman Hebert, that he would be glad to raise the matter himself but suggested I contact Frank Slattshek when he returns to the office on Wednesday from his trip abroad. Hogan felt it may be necessary for State to make a representation directly to Chairman Hebert. [Redacted] was informed.

9. [Redacted] Marian Czarneski, Chief of Staff, House Foreign Affairs Committee, called and requested that we send him a copy of the Director's 11 October 1973 testimony on Chile before the Committee, which was sent to him. (Information from that transcript had been leaked to the press a day or two after the hearing.)
