MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

I attended a briefing yesterday on the subject of drugs as an aid to interrogation. The following was gleaned from the rather prolonged intra-professional exchange.

1. There are no known "brain-washing" drugs.
2. If the interrogator wishes to "break" the subject completely, drugs will speed the process, but must be used in conjunction with physical and mental abuse.
3. There may be some value in pre-exposing personnel subject to capture to a hallucinogenic agent so that they will be better prepared for its profound effects if used on them in a future situation.
4. Recommendation: That Medical Staff be asked to comment on the value of pre-exposure of our drivers to hallucinogenic agents.
