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✓ 19. [Redacted] LIAISON Saw Thomas K. Latimer, Staff Director, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, and asked him whether Chairman Edward P. Boland (D., Mass.) was still expecting an answer to the 24 May letter he had written to Admiral Turner on the [Redacted]

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[Redacted] Tom said that the Chairman still wants to receive an answer.

Tom requested that I set up a meeting for himself and Loch Johnson, of the staff, with John Waller, IG. The purpose of this meeting is to lay on procedures for the Committee to deal with personal and professional complaints by present/former Agency employees who might individually contact the Committee.

I told Mr. Latimer that there were three transcripts from hearings in May that I have not received for possible correction. He assured me that he would look into it. We also discussed whether the Committee would allow the Agency to retain transcripts from executive session hearings and I gathered that the matter was still being discussed within the Committee.

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20. [Redacted] BRIEFING Accompanied [Redacted] ORPA/NFAC, to 4304 Dirksen Senate Office Building, where she briefed Roy Werner, Senate Foreign Relations Committee staff, on Vietnam and Vietnam's foreign policy. The briefing lasted for about an hour and both Mr. Werner and [Redacted] seemed to be satisfied with the session.

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I discussed with Mr. Warner his codeword clearance and he indicated that he would also need a [Redacted] clearance inasmuch as he is working on SALT verification and developing a matrix for Senator John Glenn (D., Ohio).

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21. [Redacted] BRIEFING Accompanied John McMahon, DDO, and [Redacted] DDO, to the preliminary briefing of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence on the 7 June Presidential Finding. The session was a short one and will be followed up by another hearing by the Committee's Subcommittee on Oversight on Monday, 19 June (See Memorandum for the Record) which includes a resume of both sessions.

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✓ 25. [Redacted] LIAISON Called John Swanner, Staff Director, House Committee on Standards of Official Conduct, and we discussed the Committee's return of the notes in accordance with the DCI's request in his letter. Swanner requested that I specifically identify all of the notes. I will have to do this with EA Division. Swanner said he has little involvement in this matter which has been run by Jaworski purely as his own show, not under the control of Chairman John Flynt (D., Ga.). Swanner said that according to John Nields, Chief Counsel, the information provided by CIA did not contain any information concerning NSA. I confirmed that this was correct. Swanner also said that he was told that NSA did not send any documents to the Committee and did not allow any notes to be taken of documents made available for review. He asked that I check to determine whether or not the Committee was given access to the information concerning NSA which was reported in the press. If such is the case and the DCI feels there is "probable cause" to believe that the leak came from the Committee, then Swanner feels the DCI's position is clearly warranted. If, however, the finger cannot be pointed squarely at the Committee, he feels that the DCI's letter was unfair and might yet result in a strong reaction of rebuff from the Committee members.

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26. [Redacted] LIAISON Mary Medved, Washington Workshops, called and asked if the Director could speak to their group on 23 or 30 June in the afternoon at Headquarters. I told her I would check and be back in touch.

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27. [Redacted] LIAISON Called Betty Dooley, House Women's Caucus staff, and asked if they could arrange for 19 July between 3:30 and 4:30 p.m. for the Director to speak to the group. This is in response to their request for this date. Ms. Dooley said she would check and be back in touch with me.

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28. [Redacted] LIAISON Confirmed with Clara Buchanan, Senate Foreign Relations Committee staff, the Director's appearance on 21 June at 3:30 p.m. in S-116 of the Capitol to brief on the 7 June 1978 Presidential finding.

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
