



Wednesday - 28 June 1978

1. [redacted] LIAISON John Tipton, GAO, called to alert us that he and Dan Stanton, who conducted the GAO investigation on Nazi war criminals, have been requested to testify before the House Judiciary Subcommittee on Immigration, Citizenship and International Law, during hearings to be held on 19, 20, and 21 July. They will meet with Chairman Joshua Eilberg (D., Pa.) and staff to get clear ground rules as to their appearance. If held in open session, they will not go beyond their unclassified report. If executive session, they will not respond to any inquiries which would involve the disclosure of CIA classified information and will refer the Subcommittee to CIA. Tipton said he will stay in close touch with us and will come out next week to rereview his notes of the CIA material provided. Tipton also assured me that he will clear GAO's statement to the Subcommittee with us.

2. [redacted] LIAISON At the request of [redacted] I made arrangements for Cliff Fowler, GAO, and others from GAO to meet with Ted Shackley, designee AD/DCI/CT; [redacted] DDO; and [redacted] to discuss the GAO's draft report [redacted]. The meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, 5 July at 9:00 a.m. in the C&R Conference Room.

3. [redacted] FOIA/LIAISON Called Marie Steele, in the office of Senator Richard S. Schweiker (R., Pa.), regarding the Senator's note transmitting a request from [redacted] for a declassified CIA report "Hypnosis in Interrogation," which he says was released in 1977 by CIA. I explained to Ms. Steele that we would need a further description, especially a date of the report itself, before attempting a search. I explained this report was possibly one of many documents recently located by the Agency and only indexed chronologically. Ms. Steele said she understood fully and would be back in touch with me after calling [redacted].

[redacted] LIAISON Called Dorothy Fosdick, on the staff of the Senate Governmental Affairs Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations, to tell her that we would be willing to provide NIE 11-4-78 for Chairman Henry M. Jackson (D., Wash.) to read at his convenience, time and location. Ms. Fosdick later called back to say that because of the passage of time he no longer wanted to see the NIE and asked that we pass on that we had made no brownie points on this request. She said Senator Jackson does not see why he should be required to go through the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence to obtain intelligence reports since he is on the Senate Armed Services Committee and since that Committee has adequate storage facilities. He further feels that there is no need for the Select Committee on Intelligence to know what documents he is calling for.

23. [redacted] LIAISON Contacted Dr. Charles Russell, Chief, Acquisitional and Analysis Division, Department of the Air Force, and asked him if we could have a copy of his letter which was mentioned in an article in the New York Times on 26 June, (this is a letter which Russell sent to Representative William Lehman (D., Fla.) concerning 14 terrorist groups connected with the PLO). Dr. Russell said his letter was based on unclassified material only, and he was sure we had all the information contained in it. He said he would, however, be glad to send us a copy. I thanked him.

[redacted] LIAISON Michael Nardone, on the staff of the Subcommittee on Priorities and Economy in Government, Joint Economic Committee, called to request about 50 copies of the Agency paper on the Soviet economy, which was released earlier this week. After checking with Congressional Support Staff/NFAC, I advised Nardone that DOCEX would be able to handle requests from the press and the public and that Congressional inquiries could be referred to our office. I added that we would send him a few additional copies for the use of the Subcommittee.

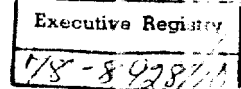


