4. FOIA/LIAISON Received a call from Miss Lois Smith, in the Portiand, Maine district office of Senator Edmund S. She thanked me and said she would so advise the constituent.

27. LIAISON Pat Long, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence staff, and Thomas K. Latimer, Staff Director, both called me with requests about the status of Herbert Romerstein, currently on the staff of Representative John Ashbrook (R., Ohio), and about to become a staffer of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence. He is scheduled to report to work (he will sit in Pat Long's office) on 27 March. but we have not reported back to the Committee on his clearance. of our office, has looked into this and apparently the file is under review by the Office of Security. I have informed Thomas Latimer that the file is still being reviewed.

28. LIAISON Loch Johnson, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence staff, requested that I obtain a copy of a <u>Studies in Intelligence</u> article by John Warner on CIA's legal position with regard to Marchetti. I said that I would look into it and get back to him.
