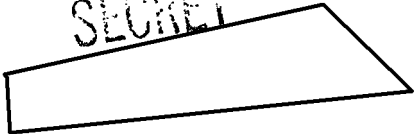

1. [redacted] LIAISON Arrangements were made for Commissioner John Ahearne, Nuclear Regulatory Commission, to review the CIA documents on [redacted] which were previously reviewed by Dr. Henry Myers, Staff Assistant, House Interior and Insular Affairs Subcommittee on Energy and the Environment, on Friday, 3 November in his office. Arrangements will be made for the other Commissioners to review the same material.

2. [redacted] LIAISON Accompanied Thomas Latimer, Staff Director, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, to the Latin American Division Chiefs of Station Conference. Mr. Latimer's remarks were well received by the group and I believe that Mr. Latimer benefited from the exposure as well.

3. [redacted] LIAISON Dick Giza, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence staff, called to find out about the status of the NFAC documents that he had requested and I passed this reminder along to [redacted] NFAC/CSS. Mr. Giza also asked me to obtain and forward to him a copy of an Agency application form for one of the staffers in the office of [redacted]

4. [redacted] LIAISON Diane LaVoy, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence staff, called and requested four documents from the Center for Studies in Intelligence, the IC Staff and NFAC. I have forwarded requests to each of them.

[redacted] LIAISON Keith Raffel, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, called to tell us that Chairman Birch Bayh (D., Ind.) had been served with a subpoena in the Kampiles case by Kampiles' lawyer and that it is his understanding that the DCI has been served as well. He wanted to know how we were planning to handle this. I passed this message on to OGC (Tony Lapham, [redacted]), as well as OLC (Frederick P. Hitz and [redacted]).

6. [Redacted] LIAISON Bernie Raimo, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence staff, called to ask that I send a message to [Redacted] Chief Counsel who is currently traveling in Europe to tell [Redacted] that Mr. Raimo will not be [Redacted] as they had anticipated. I said that I would be happy to see that the message got to [Redacted]

He also passed on a request by Ira Goldman, of the staff, who wishes to see the unexpurgated version of the Marchetti book. I said that I would look into it and get back to him.

7. [Redacted] LIAISON Received a call from Hal Ford, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, who informed me he would be at Headquarters tomorrow to finish his review of Vietnam cables regarding the evacuation of Kontum and Pleiku Provinces in 1975. I informed Ford we had no information on an American missing in the Pacific in an Air Force plane crash, but recently reportedly seen in China. I suggested Ford contact [Redacted] at DIA and gave him the phone number. Ford agreed to do so.

8. [Redacted] LIAISON Talked with Tom Crowley, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, regarding a number of planned meetings. We agreed to 29 November at 10:00 a.m. for a meeting on the Hill regarding terrorism in response to Chairman Birch Bayh's (D., Ind.) letter of 19 October. We also agreed to 9 November for the following meetings: John Waller, IG, regarding the IG's role in dissent; [Redacted] EEO, and [Redacted] OGC, regarding the grievance of former Agency employee [Redacted] a meeting with LA/DDO representatives regarding Agency knowledge of the death of Che Guevara, and a meeting with [Redacted] NE/DDO, regarding anticipated Palestinian terrorism against Americans.

9. [Redacted] LIAISON Talked with Ted Ralston, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, regarding tomorrow's visit to NPIC. Ralston informed me Bill Miller, Committee Staff Director, Earl Eisenhower, Steve Flanagan, both of the Committee staff, and himself would attend.

10. [Redacted] LIAISON Called Bill Miller, Staff Director, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, to ask if he would object if three Armed Services Committee staff members attended Ray McCrory's, Chief SALT Support Staff, scheduled briefing tomorrow on SALT verification. Miller said he would prefer to do the briefings separately.
