According to a Japanese broadcast on June 20, 1943, Chandra Bose reached Tokio in a submarine on June 14, coming from Germany; he conferred with TOJO and other high authorities; on June 16 he spoke before an emergency meeting of the Diet and asserted that Japan was India's best friend and was fighting to support her independence / on July 3 Tojo took a plane to Bangkok and he published a joint statement with the Premier of Thailand in which it was announced that Manegpan and Chintung Provinces of Burma, and four chow of Malaya had been ceded to Thailand (which owned them originally); on July 5 Tojo was in Singapore; on July 8 the League formed an Indian National Army with Chandra Bose in command; Bose then announced a Free Provisional Government for India.

Took over some of WIELEMANN's jobs when latter went to U.S.; with Dr. PFANIT and HILDEBR, was entrusted with task of eliminating aged and infirm in German hospitals; two SS friends of his, BRACK and zur LINDEN, directed the actual work; in 1940 his ambitious wife tried to make Hitler promise to give her husband the Governorship of Africa, though hen-pecked, Bouhler liked this idea, and it brought him into conflict with BOHLE, who, because he was born in South Africa and had headed Nazi unit there, felt that he was slated to be Governor of that continent; Hitler solved this by saying he needed Bohle as Gauleiter of England.

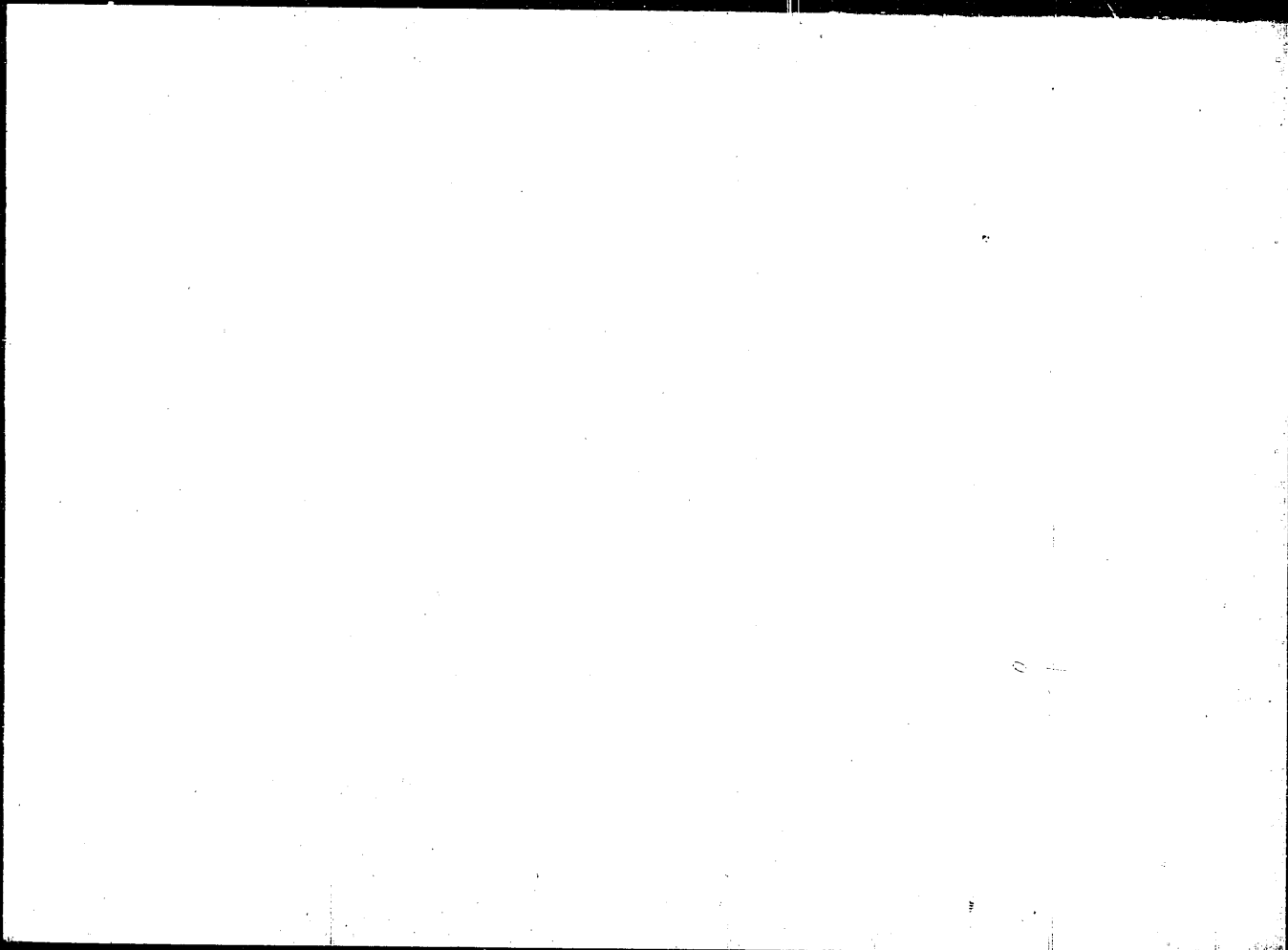

Commander in chief, German Army / born Berlin, October 4, 1851; son of Bernhard (cavalry general) and Charlotte (von Gordon) von B.; prep. education Gymnasium at Berlin; married Elizabeth von Karstedt (divorced); has one daughter and 2 sons / joined German Army as lieutenant, 3d Queen Elizabeth Grenadier Regiment, 1900; transferred later to artillery; became member General Staff, 1912; served as captain during World War I; became major after the war; became commander artillery branch, Defense Ministry, 1922; colonel in charge military training in 1930; major general in command artillery, 1932; given East Prussian command, 1933; command Leipzig Area, 1937; commander in chief German Army since 1938; early saw in Hitler and Nazi movement way to restore Germany to power; became ardent follower of Hitler; is credited with development of German mechanized and armored divisions / member Hitler's Supreme Council for National Defense.

Artillery Inspector in 1931 / succeeded BLOMBERG as commander of East Prussian Military District in Königsberg in 1933; while there, became interested in politics and in 1933-34 became involved with anti-Hitler groups, tried to interest Catholics, Conservatives, and Social Democrats in an anti-Nazi putsch, but this came to nothing / had frequent clashes with the over-president KOCH; in 1935 a crisis developed between the SS and Brauchitsch and it looked for a few days as though he would openly rebel, but Hitler's personal appearance in Königsberg quieted things down / succeeded von FRITSCH as C-in-C of Army in February 1938 during the 'bloodless purge'; from then on was responsible for conduct of war, for pogroms, Gestapo terror, the shooting of hostages etc.; even if he did not directly order these measures himself he cooperated with the regime that sponsored them / would not mix in politics as
