HANOUM, PRINCESS DJAVIDAN

Hungarian; nee Countess Toroeki ?; before her birth, her mother left her father and went to U.S. with Hungarian engineer, so subject was born in Philadelphia and could enter US without visa; could have therefore been useful to Nazis over here but source is sure she refused; was brought up in Europe, studied piano with Liszt; very gifted musician; married Abbas HILMI (see Switzerland), former Khedive of Egypt, and went to Egypt with him; learned Turkish and Arabic well; marriage broke up, she returned to Berlin and lived wretchedly on royalties from her book, Life in a Harem, and her radio scripts; great friend of Jurek von SOSNOWSKI, and stood by him through his trial though she was in no way involved herself; any possible reconciliation with Hilmi prevented by entry into her life of KULATSCHKOFF (q.v.), an unattractive Russian whose gift of second sight gave him a tremendous hold over her; in 1938 however, Hilmi paid her debts for her and she visited

English friends from Danzig on Adriatic coast; source saw her in Berlin in 1938 and felt a serious change had taken place in her; found her very careful in what she said about Nazis, whereas she had always been outspoken before; Hilmi may have withdrawn financial support, and she may have consented to Nazi propaganda work among Arabs and Turks; Kulatschkoff is anti-Semitic and therefore pro-Nazi and may have influenced her; however, if she has withstood them, she would be very useful as she is still a brilliant and courageous woman though no longer young; Hilmi or her friends in Yugoslavia would know where she was.
