d. At the time when Dollfuss prepared his coup d'etat in January, 1934 he was very unhappy as he is a real Democrat and he even tried to prevent Dollfuss from destroying the Social Democrat Party. He shed tears because of the coming disaster but was too weak to carry his point and to make Dollfuss desist from his plan.

He had always the right intention but was too weak to get his way. Even in his own family his influence was not sufficient to prevent some of his children from becoming Nazis, first clandestinely and later openly. Guido Schmidt, the well-known Nazi, was for several years the liaison officer between the president and

years the liaison officer between the president and the chancellor. It seems certain that Miklas did not recognize the true character of Schmidt.

When Hitler occupied Austria in 1938, Miklas himself signed the appointment of Seiss-Inguart as chancellor in place of Schuschnigg. After this he was dismissed and is living now on his pension.
