CZECHOSLOVAKIA

3 February 1934, "Die Chemische Industrie," No 5

The Brno Armaments Plant has received new orders from foreign countries which will require it to increase its number of workers by 1,000 for the year 1934. Previously it employed about 2,400.

10 March 1934, "Die Chemische Industrie," No. 10

The Zilina Cellulose Factory, Inc. and the Ratimon Vratimov Cellulose Factory have received orders from foreign explosives companies. The cellulose factory in Turelanský Svay Martin has been able to start operations again.

9 June 1934, "Die Chemische Industrie," No. 23

The Skoda Plant in Pilsen has recently taken on 1,500 new workers.

January 1935, "Zeitenhrift for das gesante Schiene- und Sprengstoffwesen,"
Munich, No. 1

A merger is reported taking place between the Union for Chemical and Metallurgical Production in Anesig Ustinad Labem the Czech Explosive Materials Corporation, and the chemical factories in Kolin. The two former have a common administrative council, which is also the administrative council of the Czech Nitrogen Plant.

7 August 1936, "Prager Bursen-Courier," No. 687

Brno Armaments Plant employs over 6,000. It is producing bicycles and typewriters, as well as armaments. In 1936 it sold 630 automobiles, 450 of them during the first seven months of the year. This year it has sold only 301 in the same period.

31 August 1936, "Deutsche Allgemeine Zeitung," No. 407

Skoda and Comke-Moravska in Brno are working together on an order for tanks for Rumania.
