2. At the Central Administration for Health, Russian Lt. Colonel Jevsukov has been interviewing the employees individually. The head of the Personnel Section in this Central Administration, Dr. Schoelmerich, stated that personnel policy has been tightened by order of SMA. All positions must be filled with SED members. This is supposed to be in preparation for a Soviet diplomatic offensive against the USA. Scholmerich said that Lt. Colonel Jevsukov told him that impetus was given to this policy by Secretary of State Byrnes Stuttgart speech.
