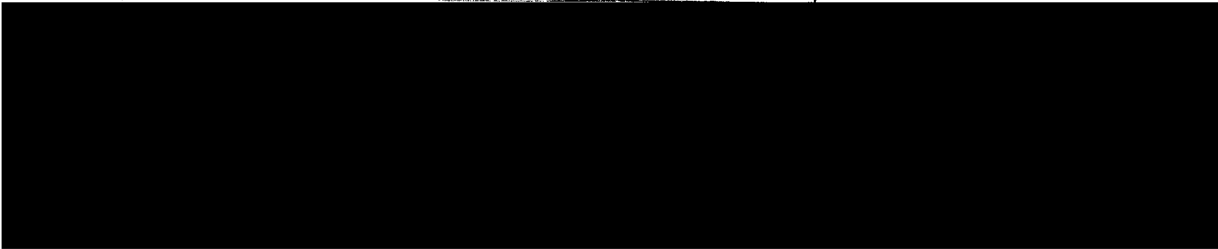

1. In the Karawanken Alps, a system of blockhouses has been erected at intervals of one to one and a half kilometers. Each blockhouse has eight men assigned to it as well as a number of trained dogs. There are no supporting troops stationed nearby but the neighboring villages are occupied by military units.
2. In Notranjsko (Inner Krain) and Primorska near Trieste and Gorizia, maneuvers with heavy artillery are constantly being carried on. During September there were elaborate maneuvers in the vicinity of Kranj. These operations take place under the supervision of Russian instructors.
3. On 20 September there were 171 Yugoslav boats in the river ports of Passau, Regensburg and Engelhartzell. On 5 September, Antulovic Ulaho, an official of the Yugoslav "Flusschiffahrts Gesellschaft" in Passau, turned two of these boats over to the Russians.
4. A large number of employees who were recently dismissed by the First Danube Steamship Company in Vienna were immediately recruited by Russian agents. The agents are searching all zones for former German marine officers and soldiers who served on type 21 or 25 submarines. It is reported that these craft are to be used for the launching of V-weapons.
5. During the last few months, shipments of gasoline, salt and grain have been transported from the Black Sea to Kladovo where they are reloaded for points in Yugoslavia. Twenty loads of ore from the Bor mines are shipped from Prahaovo daily.
6. Soviet monitors have recently been observed in Novisad.
7. It is estimated that before the war, the Germans had 6000 trained technicians for mine-clearing. Of this total, 1250 have supposedly been recruited by the Russians.
8. According to Yugoslav officers who were stationed with Russian units in the Banat area near Kikinda, Sentam Vrsac and in southern Serbia, there are from 50,000 to 55,000 Russian instructors, officials and soldiers in Yugoslavia.
