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SUPPLEMENT 50X1-HUM

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1. Grojec - Slomczyn (P95): The airfield covers an area of one x one kilometer, was built by the Germans in 1944 and has no concrete runways. There were about forty planes on the field which is under guard. A training company from Deblin was stationed at the field which is subordinate to the Deblin Flying School.
2. Rzeszow (V74) - Jasionka (V75): The airfield has a concrete runway 600 meters long. One hangar is in good condition, two were destroyed. Fifteen bombers were seen on the airfield.
3. Opole (Oppeln-J17): The airfield covers an area of two x two kilometers and has no concrete runways. It has five hangars and about 100 earth shelters for planes. There were approximately ninety aircraft on the field (monoplanes and biplanes). A Soviet Air Force regiment was stationed there.
4. Brzeg (V66): This airfield is larger than the one at Opole. It has two hangars, but there are no concrete runways. Soviet Air Force units were quartered at Hermanowice (V54).
5. Czestochowa (T63 - Kucelin): This is a pre-war airfield: About fifteen planes, having Soviet crews, were seen.
6. Rendziny (Silesia): This airfield was constructed by the Germans and has a concrete runway two kilometers long. A Soviet fighter squadron was stationed there.
